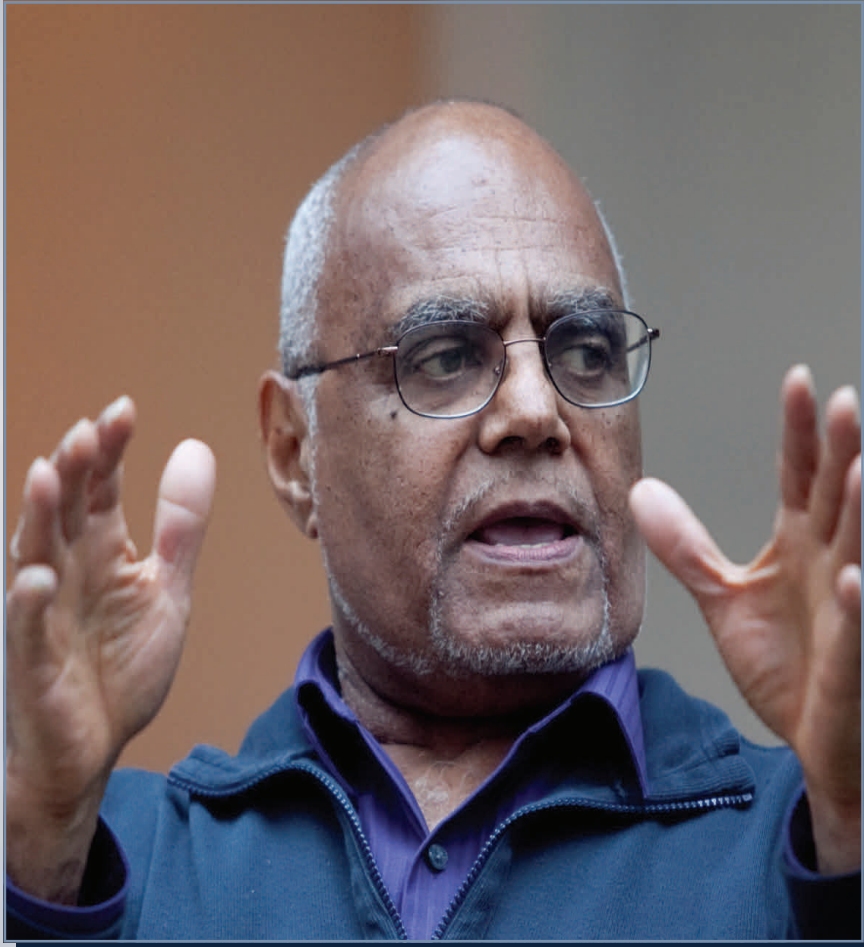


The Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday Observance at Emory University

Robert “Bob” Parris Moses is Founder and President of the Algebra Project, Inc. He received his BA from Hamilton College (1956), and his MA in Philosophy from Harvard University (1957). He received a MacArthur Foundation Fellowship (1982-87), and subsequently started the Algebra Project (AP), which uses mathematics as an organizing tool for a Quality Education as a Constitutional Right (QECR) for all students. Moses is co-author of *Radical Equations—Civil Rights from Mississippi to the Algebra Project* (Beacon, 2001) and co-editor of *Quality Education as a Constitutional Right—creating a grassroots movement to transform public schools* (Beacon Press, 2010).
